Caseley, Judith. Bully. Greenwillow, 2001. ISBN: 0688178677. Mickey finds that it is easier to talk about loving your enemies than actually doing it. But he brings about a truce with his good-friend-turned mean, Jack. with cookies and a few kind words.

De Paola, Tomi. Oliver Button is a Sissy. Harcourt, 1979. ISBN: 0152578528. Oliver is teased because he attends dance class.

Henkes, Kevin. Chrysanthemum. Greenwillow, 1991. ISBN: 0688096999. When Chrysanthemum starts school, some kids make fun of her name.

Nickle, John. The Ant Bully. Scholastic. 1999. ISBN: 0590395912 Lucas learns a hard lesson when he is forced into an ant colony, diminished in size, tried for his crimes against ants, and sentenced to hard labor.

O'Neill, Alexis. The Recess Queen. Illus. Laura Huliska-Beith, Scholastic, 2002, ISBN 0-439-20637-5. In this sassy playground romp, a tiny new kid, Katie Sue, dethrones the reigning recess bully, Mean Jean, by doing the unthinkable --

she invites her to be her friend!

Pilkey, Dav. The Hallo-Wiener. Blue Sky Press, 1995. ISBN: 0-0590-41703-7. Dogs make fun of Oscar the dachshund until one Halloween, dressed as a hot dog, he rescues other dogs from cats. (Lots of puns. Deals with feelings hurt by teasing.)

Polacco, Patricia. Mr. Lincoln's Way. Philomel Books; 2001. ISBN: 0399237542. The principal, Mr. Lincoln, strives to help "Mean Gene" overcome his prejudice toward people of other races using the boy's love of birds as jumping off point.

Simon, Francesca. Hugo & the Bully Frogs. Illus. Caroline Church. (Ages 4-8) David & Charles Children's Books; 1999. ISBN: 186233093X. Fed up with being intimidated by a gang of bullies, quiet Hugo enlists the aid of Duck to teach him a way to scare them off.

Williams, Linda. The Little Old Lady Who Was Not Afraid of Anything. Illus. Megan Lloyd. Thomas Y. Crowell, 1986 ISBN 0-690-04585-0. When an old lady faces scary figures in the forest and speaks to them directly, she transforms them into something not scary at all.

Seidler, Tor. **Mean Margaret**. HarperCollins, 1997. ISBN: 0062050907. When a newly wed woodchuck couple find an impatient selfish, wailing human toddler and take her into their home, they demonstrate how the values of love and kindness lead to changes in everyone--human and animal.

The author describes bullying methods deployed by girls: backbiting, exclusion, rumors, name-calling, and targeting manipulative psychological pain on victims. Drawing on her training in political science and women's studies, she explores the epidemic, distinctive, and destructive aggression of girls.


